Limerick Congratulates New Chief of Police

The Board of Supervisors and Limerick Township is pleased to congratulate R. Brian Skelton on his promotion from Lieutenant to Chief of Police.

Brian began his career in 1989 as a part time police officer for Royersford Borough. In 1990, Brian was hired as a full time police officer with the Limerick Township Police Department and has risen through the ranks from Community Policing Officer to Patrol Sergeant and on to Patrol Lieutenant. Brian established Limerick's first Bike Patrol Unit and assisted in the formation of the Montgomery County Youth Aid Program.

Brian is a graduate of Spring-Ford High School and the Montgomery County Police Academy. In addition to his extensive training, Brian holds both an Associate Degree in Criminal Justice and a Bachelor Degree in Criminal Justice Administration.

Brian was sworn in as Chief on February 16th by Judge Walter Gadzicki and is pictured below with the entire Police Department.



Message from the Chairman

I am pleased to be writing as your new Chairman and I thank my fellow colleagues on the Board for their confidence in offering me this position. My service to this community spans 30 years, which includes positions on Parks and Recreation and Grant Writing Committees and 14 years serving as an elected Supervisor. Limerick has experienced many changes over this time period, with the most significant being the ongoing growth of the community, which currently consists of close to 19,000 residents. The Township also remains a favorite location choice for businesses and they invest in our community and provide the jobs, goods and services desired by the residents. Planning projections show that Limerick will remain a desired designation for both business and residents for many more years.

This ongoing growth and the demand it places on Township services was at the forefront of the Board's public meetings held last Fall as we worked on the Township's 2016 Budget. While other local municipalities struggle to maintain basic levels of service, the Board is pleased to report that Limerick's financial foundation remains strong, based on the success of the Township's long-standing business plan. This plan contributed to Limerick's 2015 real estate tax rate remaining in the lower third of all 62 Montgomery County communities, while providing high levels of services across all operational departments. For 2016, additional funding was not required to maintain all current service levels and a balanced General Fund Budget was achieved.

The Supervisors' obligations to maintain the health, safety and welfare of the community, however, cannot be limited to a single budgetary year and must take into account future needs of the Township. Limerick enjoys many strong attributes that are here today because of the dedication and foresight of those who have served in the past. Previous articles within this newsletter forum have spoken to the growing demand on our public safety departments, and in particular, the Limerick and Linfield Volunteer Fire Companies and the Township's Police Department. The approved budget puts in place goals and objectives for a program of support for the fire companies to assist them with a long term capital program. While no additional tax funding was needed for this endeavor, additional funding was required above the base line budget in order to begin to answer the growing demands on the Police Department. Specifically, the Budget calls for additional taxes toward the cost of three additional police officers to strengthen police protection for this community. While it is always difficult to ask our fellow residents for additional funding, the risk of doing nothing holds far greater consequences, not only for those who call Limerick home today, but for future generations as well.

I hope you will take the time to read the inside article recapping the 2016 Budget and the positive public safety programs it will support. I wish you all a wonderful spring season.



2016 Budget Update: Strengthening Police Protection

On December 15, 2015 the Board of Supervisors approved the Annual Budget for 2016. The process by which a municipal budget is formulated takes several months and begins in September with departmental meetings to determine goals and objectives. Two advertised public meetings specific to the budget were held in addition to budget discussions that took place during normal public Board of Supervisors meetings in November and December.

During these discussions, administration reported to the Board on all operational departments and their funding needs to provide the same level of service for 2016. Limerick is proud to provide the vital services needed of the community in a cost effective manner which is reflected in the lower than average real estate tax rate. These low tax rates are a result of the Limerick Township Business Model which has been in place since 2006 and pictured below. Another goal of the business model has also been achieved and is shown in the graph below which notes that 45% of budget revenues are derived from non-tax sources.




In analyzing the needs of 2016, the Board was pleased that the same level of services provided in 2015 could be offered to the community without the need for additional tax funds. However, growing calls for service within the police department could not be ignored. Long term studies identified that a force of 30 sworn officers would meet the current demands of the Township. A commitment to strengthen police safety was approved by the Board with the hiring of three additional police officers to supplement the current force of 25. To cover the cost of the new positions, the 2016 Budget calls for additional tax support from the community. While the impact of this increase is recognized, police protection is vital to all within the Township and must be supported and strengthened in order to ensure the safety and welfare of the Limerick community.

As the Township continues to answer the service needs of the community, the Board stands committed to the principles of the Township business model and the proper stewardship of the public funds of which they are entrusted.

Limerick Township Business Model

- Improve **efficiencies** and reduce costs without a reduction in the level of services
- Seek **alternative non-tax revenues** to lessen the tax burden of existing residents
- Institute **long range planning** to properly position Limerick for the next phase of growth



Spring Tax Update: Spring-Ford Per Capita Tax Eliminated

The Per Capita tax was a flat tax (sometimes referred to as a “head tax”) levied on all residents of the Spring-Ford Area School District who were 18 years or older. This flat tax was levied once a year, every July, for the new school tax year under the authority of the school code and the Local Tax Enabling Act.

The Spring-Ford School Board approved a resolution discontinuing the per-capita tax in a unanimous vote during a board meeting this past September. The decision goes into effect July 1, 2016, for the 2016-17 school year. **Residents will no longer be billed for this tax.**


