Dear Limerick Resident,

The spring and summer months are always busy and exciting as outdoor activities become the focus of many. Whether it involves youth sports, summer camps, pick-up basketball games, hiking through open space, or leisurely strolls in the park or on a trail, Limerick is proud of the diverse parks and recreational offerings available to our residents. Prior to 2008, the Recreation Department was comprised of an all-volunteer committee which established the Township's annual Community Day event in 2004. The committee worked tirelessly to meet recreational needs of the growing Limerick community, but the continued growth of the Township strained our dedicated volunteers. Recognizing the need to support the volunteers, the Board of Supervisors approved a paid part-time recreation staffing position in 2008 to work alongside the committee members.

Today, the Parks and Recreation volunteer committee is supported by a full-time staff of three, who work diligently throughout the year to offer programs and activities for our children, seniors, and families; they also are assisted by a seasonal work force of 80 individuals, who help to provide fun and educational camp activities to over 400 children annually. The Committee and the Parks & Recreation Staff also work in cooperation with the Spring-Ford Chamber of Commerce on our Community Day event, now in its 15th year, which continues to grow and celebrate this wonderful Limerick community. In partnership with the Spring-Ford Rotary Club, the third annual Wine, Beer, and Food Festival will take place in September raising money for local charity and civic organizations, including providing funding assistance to the Township to upgrade the Community Park.

The Board's commitment to parks and recreation is not limited to programming. Over the past decade, the Township has added approximately 125 acres of park and open space available to all Limerick residents. Several miles of trails, which connect Township parks and open space to our neighborhoods, has also been added, thanks to approximately \$1.5 million of grant funding awarded to the Township to offset construction and design costs. Grant monies, combined with proper long-term planning and sound business operational strategies, have enabled the Board to expand all levels of parks and recreational services while maintaining below-average township real estate taxes when compared to all other 62 Montgomery County municipalities.

Parks and recreation are an important component of the services provided by the Township and contributes to the overall vitality of this Limerick community, which makes this a wonderful place to raise a family. I hope you will take a few minutes to read the parks and recreational information contained within this newsletter. I wish you all a wonderful spring and summer season!

Parks & Recreation—Over a Decade of Growth

The department provides recreational programs and activities to the community which has grown from 13,534 residents in 2000, to an estimated population of over 20,000 as projected by the U.S. Census Bureau for the year 2020. Working in cooperation with the volunteer Parks and Recreation Committee, the Township seeks to provide a variety of recreational opportunities that appeals to all age groups within Limerick.

Community Events – Department now offers 13 events to all age groups; over 9,000 individuals participated in 2018

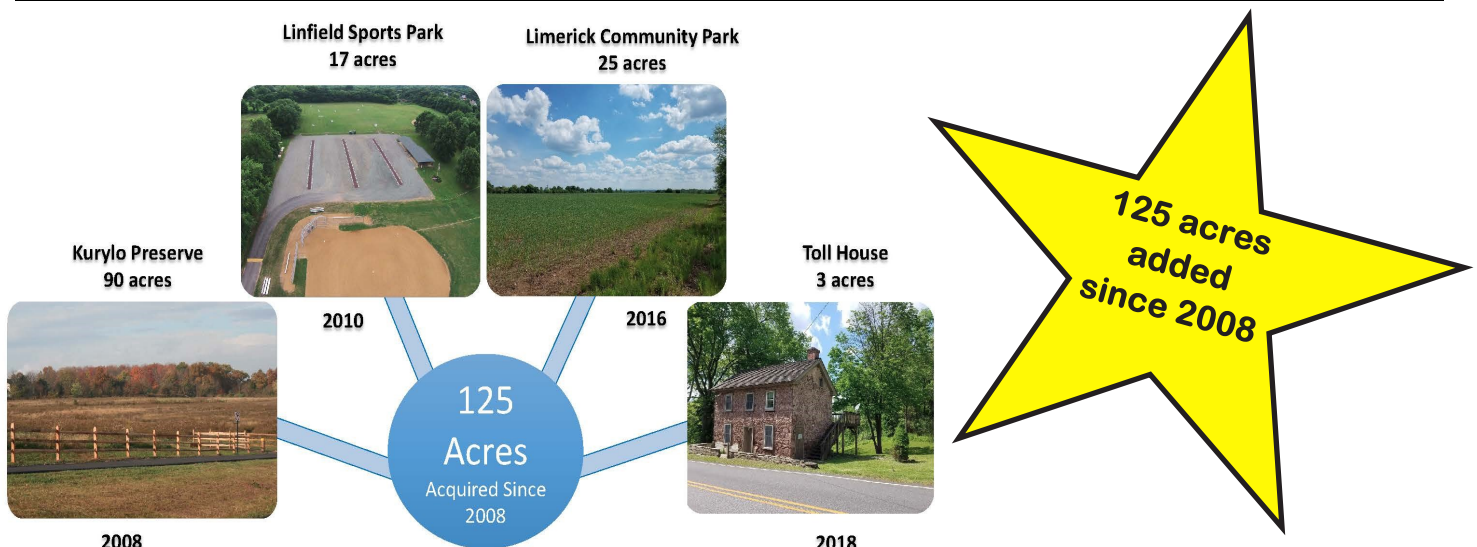
Limerick Township Park and Open Space



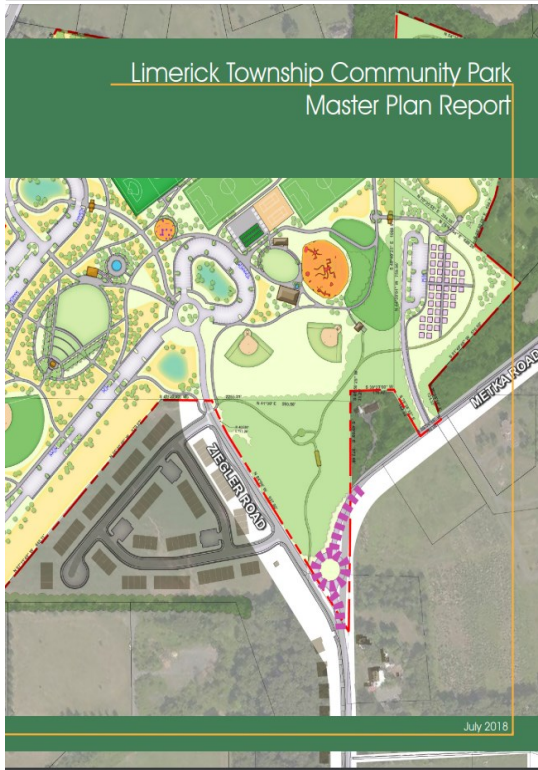
In 2006, The Limerick Township Open Space Plan Update noted 3,087 acres are protected within the township. Today, that number stands at 3,510 acres which includes State, County and Township lands, along with Private and Public School lands.

Limerick Community Park Master Plan Moves Forward



The Board of Supervisors commissioned a park Master Plan Study in 2017 with the objective of incorporating the newly acquired 25 acres from the Sankey family into a revitalized plan for the entire Limerick Community Park, which now consists of 81 acres of recreational and open space land. The Master Plan was adopted by the Board in July of 2018, and is a result of resident feedback gathered from several public meetings and an on-line survey. Grant applications to the PA Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) and the PA Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED) have been submitted. The Township is seeking \$650,000 in grant funding to offset the first phase of improvements, as depicted in the multi-phased Master Plan. Phase One improvements include a new entrance and parking off Swamp Pike, ball fields, trails, playground, pavilion, outdoor courts and a community center. All proposed amenities were key recommendations of the resident advisory committee and the public who participated in the yearlong study and on-line survey. When this multi-phased Master Improvement Plan is completed over the course of several years, the award-winning Limerick Community Park will continue to be the cornerstone of the entire Limerick Parks System for future generations.

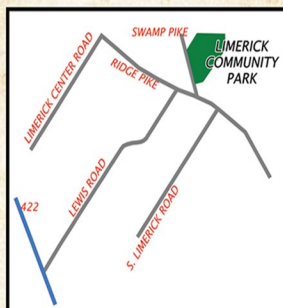

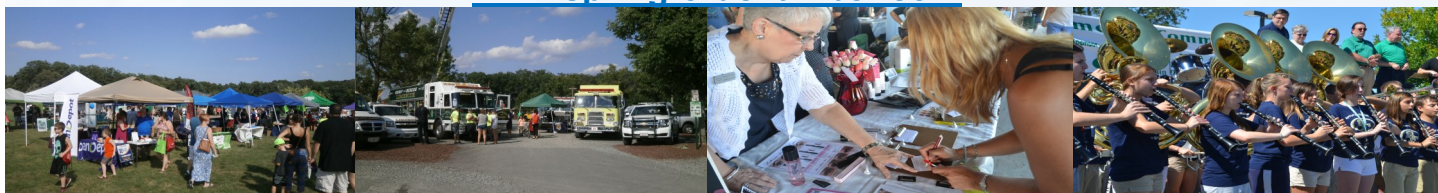
