

For every real estate tax **\$1** you pay, **\$0.08** remains within Limerick Township and is used to fund services which are vital to the community including: police, public works, fire and emergency services, and parks & recreation.

Message from the Chairman



With the onset of cooler weather and the beautiful colors of fall, we are reminded that the holiday season is fast approaching and 2019 is coming to an end. The fall is also the time period when the Board must again begin the process of preparing the Annual Budget for the next fiscal year. Every local municipal organization is required to approve a budget for the upcoming calendar year by December 31st.

While the budget is only required to detail township finances for a 12-month period, Limerick utilizes long-range planning techniques to review all township operations. This approach enables a comprehensive review to ensure no particular single-year budget line item will adversely

This long-term budget **Chairman** approach has proven very beneficial and has enhanced the Board's decade-long policy of providing the highest level of service possible, without a strain on the tax payers of this wonderful Limerick Community. The Board is very proud that while providing core services required of the community, which are: police, emergency medical, public works, parks, open space and recreation, Limerick has steadily been able to maintain below-average real estate tax rates when compared to all other 62 municipalities in Montgomery County.

As we look to the preparation of the Annual Budget, a focus for 2020 will be to build on the successes we have achieved and recommit to long-range planning, so the township is properly positioned for the upcoming decade of growth. Towards this effort, the township will begin a comprehensive update to the Open Space Plan to ensure a balance between commercial and residential growth and the preservation of our natural resources. Established an Award-Winning Business Strategy which culminated in a AAA Bond Rating and eliminated ALL Township Debt.

Community Safety

Improved Police Services by adding **10** officers and **2** K-9 units, for a total of **36** sworn police officers, which provides for enhanced focus on child and domestic issues, substance abuse, and traffic safety patrols.



Public Works Projects

Supported the Volunteer Fire Companies' merger into a single Limerick Fire Department which has strengthened volunteerism and emergency response services. Established a Funding Support Policy for Emergency Medical Services.

Skilled Public Works Crew, with experience in constructions and trades, performed road work, construction, and park projects in-house, effectively saving the Township **\$2.16** million over the past decade.

Accomplishments



Established a Parks & Recreation Department to support the Volunteer Committee

Extremely popular Shamrock Summer Camp Program—enriching **400** campers each year. Currently offering over **30** adult and youth programs and **13** annual community events.



Township Open Space

Added 125 acres without the need for additional taxes. Acquisitions through grants and donations include the Kurylo Preserve, Linfield Sports Park, additional 25-acres to Limerick Community Park, and the historic Toll House property.

\$2.46 million in grant funding received.



Township Trails Network

Secured **\$1.42** million in trail construction grant funding to enhance pedestrian walkability and recreational opportunities, which provides increased economic, social, and health benefits to all township residents.



Open Space Plan Update

Township Supervisors recently approved an update to the 2006 Open Space Plan, with Volunteer Citizens Advisory Panel meetings beginning in late 2019. This new Open Space Plan, with an objective to preserve the natural resources of the Township, will be a continuation of other long-range planning efforts which include:





Following the heavy rain storms of last year, the culvert along Trinley Road proved to be undersized, in disrepair, and in need of replacement. The Township's Public Works Department performed the replacement over a span of thirty-three days and saved approximately **\$150,000**.


