With COVID numbers on a steady decline, Limerick Township continues our return to pre-pandemic levels of service, while still maintaining safety precautions. The Township, especially the Parks & Recreation Department, is excited that programs and events cancelled last year are returning, including Limerick's popular Shamrock Summer Camps and flag football league, along with the addition of many new specialty camp programs for kids and seniors.

We are pleased to announce the Spring-Ford Chamber of Commerce's *Limerick Community Day* will return on Saturday, August 14th, as well as, the Spring-Ford Rotary's *Limerick Uncorked Festival*, which will take place on Saturday, October 2nd; both events are being hosted by the Township at the Community Park, home of the Manderach Playground.

Even though declining, the COVID-19 crisis continues to impact many in our community, including our small businesses. Small business continues to be an important backbone of this community and in addition to providing jobs, goods, and services to our residents, they sponsor youth sport leagues, donate to local charities, and contribute to the vitality of this community. Their success should be our concern and the best way to show your support is to purchase locally and invest your shopping dollars with our Mom-and-Pop businesses.

Since so many of our community events and Parks & Recreation programs take place in our public parks, the Board continues to work to strengthen the growing network of Township parks, open space, and trail systems. The first step in this effort will be the approval of the 2021 Comprehensive Open Space Plan, anticipated to take place this summer. Once adopted, this new Plan will provide updated goals and objectives for the preservation of Limerick's natural resources, the expansion of park and open space, and options to enhance the Township's growing trail system. The Plan will be a proactive step to offset the growing impact of development and to maintain the ideals and vitality of this wonderful Limerick community.

The Township is proud that Limerick Fire Department will be the host for the Annual Firemen's Association of the State of Pennsylvania's 2021 Convention & Parade, which kicks off on Wednesday, September 22nd. The event will bring fire departments from across the state to Limerick for several days of training and educational seminars. The convention concludes with a not-to-be-missed parade along Ridge Pike on Saturday, the 25th. Details of the event can be found on page 4. With 100 + years of volunteer fire service within Limerick Township, this convention and parade will celebrate the public safety and protective services our current volunteers, and all those who served before them, have offered to this community. 
