Over the past several years, an increasing use of fireworks has become part of many private events and family gathering because of changes in state retail laws which make fireworks more readily available for recreational gatherings.

Prior to the use of any firework, we ask that you become familiar with the Township's regulations regarding times and locations on your property in which they can be utilized. Please be respectful of your neighbors and recognize the impact fireworks may have on them and their family pets.



Limerick Township Fireworks Regulations are highlighted in this newsletter; please call the Township if you have any questions on the proper use of fireworks.

This newsletter also offers a review of a ***Ballot Referendum*** that will be placed before our voters this Fall in the November General Election, ***regarding an increase in the Earned Income Tax for the purchase and maintenance of Open Space.***

The specific ballot question is printed in this newsletter, along with information on the benefits of a designated income stream for Open Space, as well as what income is exempt from the tax increase.



It is important to note that the proposed tax would be **limited to a ten-year time frame and only enacted if approved by a majority of the voters.** This tax is a useful tool the Township can use to protect the remaining natural resources of this community and to help in limiting development.

It is important that your voice be counted, so please familiarize yourself with the benefits and impacts of this proposed tax and make sure you VOTE this November.

This decision is up to you, the Limerick Township residents!

Tips from the Fire Marshal

As the Summer season brings folks outdoors for celebrations and family gatherings, Shaun Semmeles, Fire Marshal, has provided some important safety reminders in hopes everyone enjoys the season responsibly.

Please keep your fellow neighbors in mind when outdoors with common courtesies used for the volume of music and the use of fireworks.

Some residents may be more sensitive to noises and animals can get anxious. With advance notice, your neighbors can secure their animals and take measures to prepare themselves; having those neighborly conversations over the fence could go a long way to making the summer enjoyable for everyone.



Firework Safety

- Never allow young children to play with or ignite fireworks.
- Do not ignite fireworks or sparkling devices while the person is under the influence of alcohol, a controlled substance or another drug.
- Do not ignite fireworks within **200** feet of an occupied or unoccupied structure.

Do Not Ignite Consumer Fireworks After 10:00 P.M.

The following are exceptions:


4th of July — 11:00 P.M.

*New Year's Eve — 12:30 A.M.
on New Year's Day*

Grill Safety

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.

SUMMER STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

Here are some tips for managing stormwater on your property this summer:

1) Wash your car at a car wash. When you wash your car on the driveway or the street, grease, soap and oil can wash into streams and creeks.

2) Never dump anything down stormwater drains. Remember that storm drains empty directly into local waterways without being treated so whatever enters storm drains will flow into streams and creeks.

3) Direct downspouts over porous, not paved surfaces. Where possible, direct downspouts into garden beds, your lawn or consider installing a rain barrel.

4) Raise your mower height. Raising your mower height to at least 3 inches will slow the flow of water over your lawn and allow it to absorb more rain water.

Grilling Safety

There's nothing like outdoor grilling. It's one of the most popular ways to cook food. But, a grill placed too close to anything that can burn is a fire hazard. They can be very hot, causing burn injuries. Follow these simple tips and you will be on the way to safe grilling.

SAFETY TIPS

- » Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- » The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- » Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- » Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill.
- » Never leave your grill unattended.
- » Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.

CHARCOAL GRILLS

- » There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
- » If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- » Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- » There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire. Be sure to use an extension cord for outdoor use.
- » When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.


PROPANE Grills

Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles. If your grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off both the gas tank and the grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department. **If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department.** Do not move the grill.

If the flame **goes out**, turn the grill and gas off and wait at least **5 minutes** before re-lighting it.



Wear it Like a Pro

The first sign of a rookie paddler is someone who isn't wearing a life jacket. Experienced paddlers wear life jackets whenever they're on the water.

Make it Fit

Adjust your life jacket so that it's snug and comfortable. It should not lift up when pulled by the shoulders.

Modern life jackets come in all sizes, with models for children, women and men.

85% of fatal canoeing accidents and

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
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KNOW YOUR LIMITS

Be Honest With Yourself

Good paddlers know their limits. If you don't feel comfortable in a given set of conditions, return to shore.

The Right Boat for the Conditions

Most kayaks, canoes and SUPs are designed for use on protected waters and moderate currents.

Specialized boats are used for whitewater, surf and exposed lakes or ocean. Know the capabilities of your craft. These venues require additional training.

Explore Your Limits Safely

Improving your skills is one of the joys of paddling. Practice in safe conditions with instructors or expert paddlers to expand your personal performance envelope.

Impairment = Accidents

Do not go paddling if you should not be driving. Drinks and drugs are even more hazardous on the water. Coast Guard and state DUI laws apply to all vessels, which includes recreational canoes, kayaks and SUPs.



**CARRY THE PADDLING
ESSENTIALS**

Safety

Always carry drinking water. Keep signaling devices (whistle, mirror, flares) in a pocket of your life jacket.

A Personal Locator Beacon (PLB) will relay your precise location to rescue agencies if you're in distress.

Sit-inside kayakers should carry a paddle float and pump.

Communications

A handheld VHF radio allows you to communicate with the Coast Guard and commercial boat traffic. Use Channel 16 for emergencies.

Comfort

Carry extra layers of clothing in a waterproof "dry bag." For longer outings, bring energy bars or a lunch.

Treat the Forecast as the Best Case

Have a exit strategy at all times. If a fast-moving thunderstorm appears, where is the nearest safe landing?

Pay Attention

Scan the horizon for dark clouds, and be aware of changing temperatures and wind directions, which often precede a squall or thunderstorm.

Prepare for the Worst Case

Don't wait for bad weather. If you sense a change for the worse, get off the water right away.

For canoeists and kayakers, air temperature is less important than wind speed and direction. And while rain can be a nuisance, lightning is dangerous.

Prepare to Paddle Safely

Life Jackets

Intended for offshore use. Because of their bulk, they are not recommended for paddlers.




Near-shore buoyancy vests. They are not recommended for paddlers.



Flotation Aid. They are recommended for paddlers.



Throwable devices. These are not required on canoes or kayaks and are not to be used as substitutes for life jackets.



These are special use life jackets. They may be appropriate and recommended for certain uses by paddlers.



WEAR IT!

Be safe and keep your life jacket snug.



Read the USCG-approved life jacket label. The right fit provides the right flotation. Remember, it doesn't work if you don't wear it!

Basic Boating Safety

All boats have one thing in common—safety. No matter what type of boat you try, make sure you bring the right equipment and know how to use it.

The most important piece of safety equipment is a life jacket. Everyone must have one and anyone 12 years of age and under must wear it while underway in a canoe, kayak or boat under 20 feet in length.

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
There are many types of life jackets. Your best choice for a day out on the lake will probably be a near-shore buoyant vest or a flotation aid. A near-shore buoyant vest is a good, low-cost option and is great for beginners. A flotation aid is a good compromise between comfort, function and cost.



Throwable devices – minimum 16.5 pounds of buoyancy designed to be grasped, not worn.



Find Your Fit


A properly fitted life jacket is more comfortable and will function better. Avoid a life jacket that is too large. If you fall into the water, it can slip over your head.

Get a good fit with the touchdown test. Raise your arms like you are signaling a touchdown in a football game. Have a partner lift the life jacket by the shoulders. The life jacket should come no higher than your chin. If it does, tighten the straps and try again. Try a different size life jacket if you are unable to get the correct fit.




Sound Producing Device

Motorboats less than 65 feet in length must carry some mechanical means of making a sound signal. This device may be hand-, mouth- or power-operated. An athletic coach's whistle is an acceptable device for small motorboats.



There are also lots of other regulations on fire extinguishers, navigation lights and other items, depending on the type of boat you are going to use. Review the *Pennsylvania Boating Handbook* to learn more about safe boating at www.fishandboat.com/bookboat.htm.
