Message from the Chairman

Welcome, Spring!

In 2026, Limerick will celebrate the 300th “Spring” season of our Township community and planning is underway for this exciting event. As we prepare for Limerick’s 300th birthday celebration, planning for the current and future needs of the community remains a priority. To answer the call for more parks and recreational space, an update and expansion of the award-winning Limerick Community Park is expected to begin soon. A reconstruction of the 25-year-old wooden Manderach Playground, with modern materials that will incorporate accessibility standards, is also anticipated to begin by the end of 2023. Construction costs for these projects will be offset with grant funding and reserve investment proceeds; therefore, the use of Limerick tax dollars is not required. The Township

has successfully utilized this funding strategy for other recent long-range capital projects, such as the newly completed 2-mile trail along the PECO utility line between Limerick Center Road and Royersford Road; \$1,762,603 was received from several grant programs which enabled the Township to construct this wonderful recreational amenity without the use of tax dollars.

Over the past 15 years, the Township has obtained approximately \$14 million in grant funding for important roadway improvements, the expansion of our trail network, and Master Plan Studies (which further our success in getting future grant funding). Utilization of grants, along with other positive business and operational strategies, has helped keep Limerick’s real estate tax rates below the average of all other 62 Montgomery County municipalities.

This newsletter also includes updated information about the Township’s expanding support of Emergency Medical Service (EMS) agencies that serve within Limerick Township. All EMS organizations are strained due to dwindling insurance reimbursements, and the Board has pledged additional financial support to ensure our residents continue to receive high-level emergency medical services. We will continue to work with our state and federal elected officials so the burden of EMS services is not placed solely on local communities. It is important that all levels of government, along with insurance and healthcare organizations, work together on sustainable financial support to ensure local EMS organizations can continue to serve their communities with proper resources and highly trained personnel.

The Township remains a desired location for many who wish to move here to raise a family and experience the wonderful community amenities that has drawn so many to Limerick in the past. With your support, the success we will achieve today will benefit current residents, and also ensure future “Spring” seasons are as prosperous for those who will someday call Limerick their home.

As noted in our previous newsletter, Harleysville Area EMS and Trappe Fire Company Ambulance have merged in order to provide improved regionalized coverage. They are now operating under the name, Freedom Valley Medical Rescue (FVMR).



With the creation of this new EMS organization, FVMR has reached out to all the municipalities they serve in order to establish a collaborative relationship. This will insure the stability needed to carry out their mission in providing the highest quality, pre-hospital basic and advanced life-support services to the communities they serve.

Per Pennsylvania State Law, Section 1553, **Limerick Township, along with all other local municipalities, are mandated to ensure fire & emergency medical services are provided within the township. This includes providing financial assistance for these services.** However, **no** State or Federal funding has been provided to support local municipalities with this mandate.

Financial assistance to all EMS providers is becoming more vital to these organizations as insurance reimbursements continue to decline. Therefore, the Board of Supervisors has agreed to a higher-level contribution to all the EMS providers who serve the Limerick community, such as FVMR, who provides the majority of service to our community. To ensure Limerick has a voice in the operation of this new EMS organization, we are pleased to announce Limerick Township Supervisor Kara Shuler's appointment to the new FVMR Board of Directors.

As a reminder, with the increased Township EMS contribution, **Limerick residents within the FVMR coverage area will not be solicited for an annual subscription; FVMR will recognize all Limerick Township residents within their coverage area as subscribing members and will not bill for the balance of ambulance service charges not covered by an insurance company.**

This is a **\$90.00 annual savings for all households** who previously subscribed to Harleysville Area EMS and Trappe Fire Company Ambulance's annual subscription drive! **Limerick is working with other local EMS agencies who serve the Township, to ensure this benefit is provided equally to all residents.** Look to future newsletters and social media posts from the Township as these efforts continue to secure the stability of these vital service providers within our community.

1. Plant more of everything.

Plant diverse species, densely, in layers from groundcovers to trees. Plants are the essential foundation of all ecosystems.

2. Think native.

Many birds, insects and animals depend on the native plants they are adapted to.

3. Don't be too tidy.

Flower seed heads provide food for birds in the winter.

4. Use water wisely.

Keep on site where possible and provide water for wildlife.

5. Don't use insecticides.

Keep herbicides to a minimum. A healthy, varied ecosystem is resilient against most insect pests without interference.

6. Accept the imperfect.

Gardening is great for your mental and physical health, as well as the planet, so just do it and don't stress over the details.



UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS

* Take off lid, dry out paint, discard can without lid; or pour paint into plastic bag with absorbent material (clay based kitty litter, saw dust, rags) place bag and can without lid, in trash. Paint hardener can also be purchased at hardware stores.

DROP OFF GUIDELINES

- Montgomery County events are following state guidelines and public health restrictions.
- Leave items at home that are not for the event so that they are not removed accidentally.
- If you need your gas can or container returned, please tape a note to it stating that you want to keep it.
- You may arrive any time within your registered appointment window.
- Please print out your ticket or write your name and appointment time on a piece of paper.
- If you cannot attend the event, please cancel your appointment through your Eventbrite ticket or by emailing Recycling@MontgomeryCountyPA.gov, as others may be waiting for an opening.
- NO TVs, electronics, or appliances will be accepted.
- Event workers will unload your materials so please remain in your vehicle.
- BUSINESSES AND CONTRACTORS WILL BE TURNED AWAY**, no commercial/industrial waste accepted.
- Bring all substances in original containers with labels. Items must be identifiable. Do not mix materials.
- Tighten lids on all containers. If containers are leaking, pack in larger container with newspaper to soak up leaks.
- NO 25- OR 50-GALLON DRUMS ALLOWED**. Five-gallon buckets are the largest acceptable container. Maximum amount accepted per vehicle is 25 gallons or 220 pounds.
- There are no permanent drop off locations in the region for household hazardous waste, only the listed collections.
