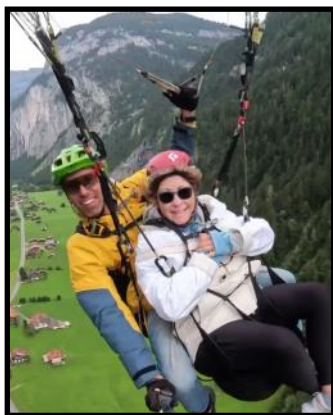

In my free time I like to watch baseball & teach. I teach Accounting & Finance on a rotating basis at four Lehigh Universities.

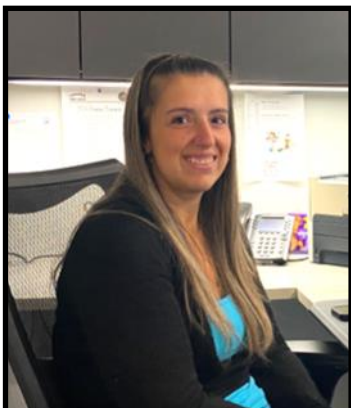
**FUN FACT:** *In college, I was scouted by a Major League team as a pitcher.*

## *Limerick Township Historical Society celebrates its 40th year*

The Limerick Township Historical Society was formed by members of the Bi-Centennial committee. The first meeting was held in the Limerick Township Municipal Building in September 1984. The 42 members saw the need to preserve historic properties & promote the history of Limerick Township.

In 1986, the Society was offered the Isaac Tyson Hunsberger House, circa 1827, as headquarters on a lease basis. The house was in disrepair and in 1987, cleanup and rehabilitation of the house and property began.

- 1994 - The house was given to the Society by Limerick Golf Club Estates.
- 1999 - Volunteers, led by Chester Kanach, begin construction for housing the Medinger cider press. It was completed a year later.
- 2000 - The house was added to the National Register of Historic Places. In the summer, the kitchen/bake oven house was restored.
- 2003 - Members of the Society were instrumental in creating the WWII monument located at the Limerick Township Veterans' Park at the Municipal Building. It was dedicated in 2005.
- 2005 - The Society helped the Stepp family add the William and Mordecai Evans House, circa 1720, to the National Register of Historic Places.
- 2023 - The Society purchases the William and Mordecai Evans House, the oldest home in Limerick Township.

\* Take off lid, dry out paint, discard can without lid; or pour paint into plastic bag with absorbent material (clay based kitty litter, saw dust, rags) place bag and can without lid, in trash. Paint hardener can also be purchased at hardware stores.

# DROP OFF GUIDELINES

- Montgomery County events are following state guidelines and public health restrictions.
- Leave items at home that are not for the event so that they are not removed accidentally.
- If you need your gas can or container returned, please tape a note to it stating that you want to keep it.
- You may arrive any time within your registered appointment window.
- Please print out your ticket or write your name and appointment time on a piece of paper.
- If you cannot attend the event, please cancel your appointment through your Eventbrite ticket or by emailing [Recycling@MontgomeryCountyPA.gov](mailto:Recycling@MontgomeryCountyPA.gov), as others may be waiting for an opening.
- NO TVs, electronics, or appliances will be accepted.
- Event workers will unload your materials so please remain in your vehicle.
- BUSINESSES AND CONTRACTORS WILL BE TURNED AWAY, no commercial/industrial waste accepted.
- Bring all substances in original containers with labels. Items must be identifiable. Do not mix materials.
- Tighten lids on all containers. If containers are leaking, pack in larger container with newspaper to soak up leaks.
- NO 25- OR 50-GALLON DRUMS ALLOWED. Five-gallon buckets are the largest acceptable container. Maximum amount accepted per vehicle is 25 gallons or 220 pounds.
- There are no permanent drop off locations in the region for household hazardous waste, only the listed collections.
