The tree and the strength of its root system is a perfect symbolism of the business philosophy pursued by Limerick over that past few decades. Like the growth the Township has experienced over this period, a tree continues to grow and branch out covering a larger area each year. To prosper, both must have strong roots and Limerick's is stronger than ever thanks to consistent, proactive planning and strategies which support the current needs of the Township and future challenges that may come to our vibrant and growing community.

The core of Limerick's business plan continues to be centered on the Township's ability to maintain below average real estate tax rates. This is an ongoing priority of the Board and is centered on the protection of Township reserve funds, which generate investment earnings that annually provide a Real Estate Tax reduction of approximately 26% to all Limerick property owners.

Discussion throughout PA has been ongoing for decades on ways to reduce real estate taxes, especially considering ongoing tax increases from school districts and counties. Limerick has successfully achieved this goal of keeping Township property taxes stable, which helps our seniors stay in their homes longer and maintains property values across this Limerick community.

Limerick's long standing business and comprehensive planning continues to provide a diverse housing stock to all family and income levels. These strategies have brought forth significant traffic and roadway improvements over the past decades and allowing for new projects such the \$1.25 million improvement to Lightcap Road, which is set to begin in 2026. Recent expansions of Limerick's Parks, Open Space, and Trail System will soon be enhanced with the \$2.4 million reconstruction of our award winning Manderach Memorial Playground. When completed in 2026, this new playground will bring enhanced play and accessibility features to all children within our community.

These community improvements would not be possible if not for the commitment and dedication of the entire Limerick organization. The Board is proud of all members of our team who work tirelessly to serve and protect Limerick, help plan for the future, and provide strong fiscal oversight over all aspects of our Township organization. The efforts of all involved make Limerick the great place it is today and the reason so many wish to live here and call our wonderful township home.

Despite increases in County and School District taxes, the Township continues to keep its Municipal Tax Rates low. While residents may be experiencing rising taxes from the County and School District, the Township remains firmly committed to responsible and prudent budgeting.

We are proud to report that our local tax rates remain among the lowest in the region, ensuring that residents continue to receive essential services without facing unnecessary financial strain. For every one dollar you pay in real estate taxes, less than 9¢ goes to Limerick Township.

These include 24/7 local Police and Fire protection, ambulance coverage, a top-notch Public Works Dept., and robust Parks and Recreation programming that serves individuals and families of all ages.



Here are some tips for managing stormwater on your property this fall:

1. Clear leaves and debris from gutters and storm drains. This will prevent flooding and keep debris out of our local waterways.
2. Shred yard and leaf waste to use as mulch or fertilizer for your yard and garden. Make sure to aim your lawnmower's chute away from roadways and drains, and let the organic matter help amend your soil.
3. Plant native trees and shrubs. Fall is the best time of year to plant. Trees and shrubs provide habitat for wildlife and help rainwater soak into the ground.

DROP OFF GUIDELINES


- NO TVs, electronics, or appliances will be accepted.
- Event workers will unload your materials so please remain in your vehicle.
- BUSINESSES AND CONTRACTORS WILL BE TURNED AWAY, no commercial/industrial waste accepted.
- Bring all substances in original containers with labels. Items must be identifiable. Do not mix materials.
- Gas containers returned upon request. Please attach a note to your container if you want it back.
- Tighten lids on all containers. If containers are leaking, pack in larger container with newspaper to soak up leaks.
- Maximum amount accepted per vehicle is 25 gallons total volume or 220 pounds total weight.
- No 25- or 50-gallon drums. 5-gallon buckets are the largest container accepted.
- There are no permanent drop off locations in the region for household hazardous waste, only the listed collections.
